Overview

- It all started with 3 people in the 1970s: an author, a Supreme Court Justice, and a Treasury Secretary.
- They wanted to overrule a "government dictatorship," a seemingly endless list of environmental, energy, safety, consumer, minority, civil rights, and other regulations.
- Rather than competing within the two-party system, they planned to create a parallel political establishment.
- They used Machiavellian "king of the hill," win-at-allcost tactics, instead of demonstrating an ability to govern.
- By 2000, they had **replaced American idealism with** an **Orwellian ideology** useful only for winning elections.



Nixon's "conservative" revolution



Won by a < 1% margin: Nixon=Humphrey= 29.7M votes; George Wallace got 9.2M.

- Pledged "an open administration...
- 9/12/70: "Nixon building OUR establishment in press, education, etc.." diary of H.R. Haldeman.
- Nixon appointed Simon to Asst. Secretary of Treasury in 1972, later replaced George Schultz, as Treasury Secretary in 1973, and appointed Powell to the Supreme Court 1972.



Powell

- Circulates memo 3 months prior to *News Twisters* - American system of free enterprise is under attack by the 4 institutions that shape public opinion: the political establishment, academy, media, and the courts.
- He attached a summary of Efron's conclusions.



Efron

- 1st exposé on liberal bias of the network news (the primary source... since 1964).
- How the views and issues of a "Silent Majority" were ignored in the 1968 elections on all three TV channels.
- Identified and articulated 33 ways of measuring bias in the news.

Simon

- A *Mein Kamph* for American politics and economics.
- Business is the target of consumer, environmental, minority (employment), and other movements.¹
- Where Reagan got his "**government is the problem**" rhetoric.

What drove their revolution?

Great Society was in full swing by 1966. A time of idealism & re-invention. It was a time of **change-the-world, free-thinking**. Doing what's right for one's country, not resume.

A seeming endless list of new business requirements:

- Worker & Consumer Protections: Equal Pay Act 1963; Cigarette Labeling Act 1965; Motor Vehicle Safety Act 1966; Fair Packaging and Labeling Act; Child Safety Act 1966; Flammable Fabrics Act 1967; Wholesome Meat Act 1967; Truth in Lending Act 1968; Wholesome Poultry Products Act 1968; Land Sales Disclosure Act 1968; Radiation Safety Act 1968;
- Civil Rights Act 1964; Voting Rights Act 1965; Immigration and Nationality Service Act of 1965; Civil Rights Act of 1968 (banning housing discrimination).
- **Environmental Protections**: Clean Air, Clean Water Acts and amendments starting in 1963; Wilderness Act 1964; Motor Vehicle Air Pollution Control Act of 1965; National Historic Preservation Act 1966; Aircraft Noise Abatement Act of 1968; National Environmental Policy Act 1969;

Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965: provided federal aid to public education (1st time)
Higher Education Act of 1965: increased Fed money to universities, created scholarships,
Social Security Act of 1965 created Medicare and Medicaid
National Endowment for the Arts and Humanities; PBS Broadcasting: noncommercial, educational.

Created a Platform by Merging Populist and Free Market Ideology

Barry Goldwater's Republicans	Gutting Social Security
Anti-feminists like Phyllis Schlafly	Rolling back civil rights
Pro-business icons like William F. Buckley, Jr.	Anti-affirmative action

Opinion influences like novelist Tom Wolfe	School choice (anti-union)
Many others at universities, think tanks, media talking heads.	Slashing taxes for the wealthy – slogans like privatization, the new federalism, "flat tax."


Nixon, Simon, & Powell Believed Goldwater lacked intellectual strength and media support



• They agreed that private investment should be used to **fund their own political establishment**, including think tanks, universities, a parallel media, and a judicial system that treated business fairly.

The Heritage Foundation



- The mother of all think tanks in its singular focus on co-opting the media.
- By 1980 the Heritage Foundation assembled the academic support that Goldwater lacked; developed policies for the incoming Reagan Administration; supplied, along with 70+ others, personnel like Attorney General Edwin Messe, Interior Secretary, James Watt, CIA Director, William Casey.
- By 2000, there were over 500 mini-Heritages across the country.


The American Spectator



- 1st major triumph: the promotion of **Charles Murray**'s attack on the welfare system.
- Welfare hurts those it's designed to help. The poor would be better off without it.
- Soon became the Reagan Administration's welfare policy.
- Tom Wolfe is a member on its board of advisers.

The New Republic



- Elizabeth McCaughey of the Manhattan Institute, summarized the 1,413 page Clinton Health Care Plan in a single article in The New Republic (now liberal).
- Although based on a raft of provably false assertions, according to Tom Wolfe, "that one article shot down the entire blimp, and Betsy McCaughey became a 35-year-old Cinderella."
- The article was later shown to be inaccurate and the magazine apologized for the story.

Manhattan Institute



- Manhattan Institute's Peter Huber promoted the term "junk science," as a way of undermining scientific work that did not conform to conservative ideology.
- Huber's book, *Galileo's Revenge: Junk Science in the Courtroom*, was found by legal and scientific scholars filled with exaggerated claims and empirical trickery.
- Clever public relations, not of any merit.

Compassionate Conservatism



- Based on a book by Myron Magnet, *The Dream and the Nightmare: the Sixties Legacy to the Underclass.*
- Reforms would require unwed mothers either to live in supervised group homes, or surrender their children to orphanages.
- Karl Rove passed the book onto George W. Bush, who said it is 2nd only to the Bible in his pantheon.

Grover Norquist, President of Americans for Tax Reform (ATR).



- Orchestrated a right-wing takeover of the College Republicans replacing moderates with ideologues.
- Helped Gingrich purge moderates from the House to become Speaker.
- Issues "talking points" every Wednesday to > 80 conservative orgs., media outlets, and top Bush White House aides.
- "Our goal is to cut government in half... so we can drown it in the bathtub." "It's not good enough to win; it has to be a painful and devastating defeat." Send a message as kings would spike their opponent's head on a stick!


Implications for futurists

- Is the control of a our schools, media, government, and courts by the wealthy really a bad thing?
- What might happen (possible futures)?
- What most likely happens when any nation is controlled by a small group of elites (probable futures)?
- What can we do to improve possible outcomes (preferable future)?

Consider what has already happened

- Free markets? What about monopolies, subsidies, conflicts of interest, and government contracts?
- Free trade? NAFTA consists of 1,700, WTO 23,000 pages of regulations.
- Whose democracy? Ours or special interests?
- History? Was America founded on religion or science?
- Economic policy jobless economics creates a downward economic spiral
 - Automation: enterprise-wide software, supply-chain management...
 - Outsourcing; off-shoring; mergers and buyouts, H-1B visas, immigration.
 - Glutted markets for automobiles, newspapers, magazines, radio, cable TV, CDs, and DVDs decrease opportunity and increase sales costs.
 - All reduce jobs, wages, benefits, and opportunities in type and variety of work; consumption, ability to pay taxes, quality of life >> downward spiral.
- Foreign Policy who needs a state department, NSA, Pentagon, etc.?
- Military Policy the protection of corporate assets first

Political ideology is propaganda



- Political ideology is disinformation. It benefits providers more than receivers.
 - The danger of a naïve working class... **unwillingness to question authority**.
 - Illusions need regular maintenance:
 language regularly twisted to justify
 behavior and keep others wondering, as
 in George Orwell's 1946 classic *Animal Farm*. E.g., "All animals are equal,
 but some animals are more equal than others."
 Is like "Separate but equal;" The Death Tax;
 No Child Left Behind; Supply-side Economics,
 Free Market Economics; reasons for the Iraq
 War...
